Growth and Creatures

Curriculum



We will taste test some of the foods that the caterpillar enjoyed but we will do so using knives and forks to practise these skills at the same time!

Literacy Communication and Language



We will continue focusing on sounds in the foods the caterpillar ate. We will make a caterpillar sound book with a page for each chosen food and label it with the correct letter.

Phonics



We will continue to explore individual letters \mathbf{s} a \mathbf{t} \mathbf{p} i and also learn how to say and write the letter \mathbf{n} .

Maths



We will play dice games and develop our speed recognition of dot patterns to 6, as well as quick numeral recognition.

Physical Development



<u>Development of ongoing skills such as:</u>

- Start taking part in some group activities which they make up themselves, or in teams
- Choose the right resources to carry out their own plan. E.g. choosing a spade to enlarge a small hole they dug with a trowel
- Collaborate with others to manage large items, such as moving a long plank safely, carrying large hollow blocks
- Make healthy choices about food, drink, activity & tooth brushing
