experience is second to none with a focus on supporting children in developing concepts of themselves as someone who can... The children learn outside every day, building an understanding that learning happens all the time and everywhere. There are many programmes for schools to give children opportunities to move during the school day. Our children move throughout every day. A child wore a step counter one day and did 12,000 steps between the

beginning and end of the school day. This was not a goal, but our children are very busy, highly motivated, professional learners so we weren't surprised.

Thank you to our Governors, who stand with us on every step of our journey. Their role has grown considerably over the years but their passion to achieve the best for the children of Beddington Infants' School is endless.

Four governors' terms of office came to an end this term. We are delighted to say that they have all agreed to a new four year term. Local Libraries


