We have had a great week developing our skills negotiating all sides of the Nursery climbing

We have had a great week developing our skills, negotiating all sides of the Nursery climbing frame, and having lots of fun on the slide!	
Curriculum	We will find out what the word 'harvest' means. We will find out how farmers harvest different types of crops and think about the food we eat, what needs to be harvested?
Literacy Communication and Language	We will read some harvest inspired stories such as The Gigantic Turnip, Oliver's Vegetables and The Little Red Hen.
Maths	We will use our subitising and one to one counting knowledge when we count out bike, car and scooter tokens.
Physical Development	Development of ongoing skills such as:  Go up steps & stairs, or climb up apparatus, using alternate feet  Use one handed tools & equipment, e.g. making snips in paper with scissors  Use a comfortable grip with good control when holding pens and pencils  Continue to develop their movement, balancing, riding (scooters, trikes & bikes) & ball skills.

FOX CUB PARENTS PLEASE READ	If you are putting grapes or cherry tomatoes in packed lunches please ensure they are cut long ways, and preferably into quarters, to avoid being a choking risk. If grapes or cherry tomatoes are whole we have to send them home.  We are a nut free school so please also ensure any food coming into Nursery is nut free.

## **Learning at home**





The first set of books don't have words, only pictures. These books are great for spotting things, telling your own story and not having to worry about reading words!
