### Curriculum



We will compare natural objects we have found during our Autumn walk and manmade objects we find in the classroom.

### Literacy Communication and Language



We will carry out lots of phonics activities such as going on listening walks, making shakers and guessing what creature or musical instrument might make the hidden sounds!

We will be reading the story <u>Mouse Paint</u> which is about 3 cheeky mice who explore how to mix paints to create new colours, we will then practise mixing paints ourselves.

### **Maths**



We will play <u>hide the teddy</u> in the garden and learn positional language such as **in**, **on**, **under**, **next to** and **inbetween**.

# Physical Development



### Development of ongoing skills such as:

Go up steps & stairs, or climb up apparatus, using alternate feet
Use one handed tools & equipment, e.g. making snips in paper with scissors
Use a comfortable grip with good control when holding pens and pencils
Continue to develop their movement, balancing, riding (scooters, trikes & bikes) & ball skills.
