

Nursery Curriculum Letter Friday 31st January 2025

Spring







We had a great week last week making and eating gingerbread men. We also ran some tests on the Gingerbread Man biscuits to see if the Gingerbread Man would have been able to swim across the river - I wonder if the children can tell you all about it?

We love the woodland walkway, next to the path, on the way into school. But, whilst the ground is muddy please can you limit your child's access to this before school as we are losing a lot of learning time having to clean shoes which are caked in mud. Thanking you all in advance.

Curriculum	Lunar New Year started on Wednesday 29th January. Next week we will learn all about the Year of the Snake and find out about the other animals in the Chinese zodiac.
Literacy Communication and Language	We will read The Great Race, The Story of the Chinese Zodiac and talk about our favourite animals from the story.
Phonics	We will continue with The Missing Button and explore a range of percussion instruments, listen to the sounds they make and try to recreate those sounds using our bodies.
Maths	We practise ordering numbers 1 - 6 (and maybe even beyond!) and we find out how these numbers look in Chinese script. We will look at how some 2D shapes fit inside other 2D shapes and make our own flat shape pictures.
Physical Development	 Development of ongoing skills such as: Match their developing physical skills to tasks and activities in the setting. E.g. they decide whether to crawl, walk or run across a plank, depending on its length & width Skip, hop, stand on one leg & hold a pose for a game like musical statues Remember sequences and patterns of movements which are related to music and rhythm Be increasingly independent in meeting their own care needs e.g. brushing teeth, using the toilet, washing & drying their hands thoroughly Start to eat independently and learning how to use a knife & fork
