

Well done to everyone on the fabulous dress up costumes on World Book Day, we thought you all looked wonderful!!

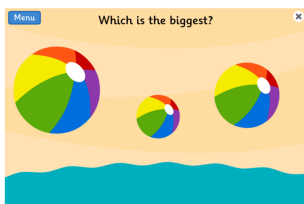
<p>Curriculum</p> 	<p>We will be creating our shopping lists for our upcoming trip to the corner shop. We will also be thinking about how we can keep healthy habits such as eating a balanced diet, doing exercise and cleaning our hair, bodies and teeth.</p>
<p>Literacy Communication and Language</p> 	<p>We will read <i>Chocolate Cake</i> by Michael Rosen and practice clapping the syllables in words from the story.</p>
<p>Phonics</p> 	<p>We will continue to read this book as a class and practice using our 'robot voices' to sound out the different items we would need for a trip to the beach.</p> 
<p>Maths</p> 	<p>We will work with numbers to 5 or 6 and keep practising recognising the Numicon pieces for use number.</p>
<p>Physical Development</p> 	<p><u>Development of ongoing skills such as:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Match their developing physical skills to tasks and activities in the setting. E.g. they decide whether to crawl, walk or run across a plank, depending on its length & width • Skip, hop, stand on one leg & hold a pose for a game like musical statues • Remember sequences and patterns of movements which are related to music and rhythm • Be increasingly independent in meeting their own care needs e.g. brushing teeth, using the toilet, washing & drying their hands thoroughly • Start to eat independently and learning how to use a knife & fork

Pairs

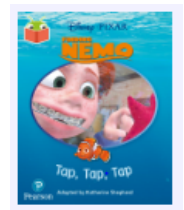
